FCS SIP Strategies

- 1. Intensity Prevention by Strengthening the Family Network and Support
- 2. Expand capacity to provide trauma-informed, attachment-based foster care to children and youth
- 3. Strengthen concurrent planning throughout the life of a case to promote permanency options for foster children and youth
- 4. Integrate implementation planning efforts to advance the integrated Core Practice Model and address the organizational change priorities emerging from the COHA process

Activities Include:

- Prevention: Resource Mapping, Mobil Response
- Placement: Resource Family Recruitment and Retention
- Family Focused Planning and Engagement: Case consultation, Child and Family Team Meetings, Red Teams (Differential Response), and bias training
- **Staff Development and Retention**: staff interviews, Chapin Hall study, supervisory framework
- Analysis and Evaluation: Child and Family Team Meetings, RED Teams, P1 case file reviews
